

334495-02 Definitions.

(A) Child abuse

An “abused child” includes any child who:

- (1) Is the victim of sexual activity, which includes children who are the victim of statutory rape, sexual assault.
- (2) Is endangered as defined in section 2019.22 of the Revised Code. A child is endangered if the person who is the parent, guardian, custodian or is in loco parentis of a child creates a substantial risk to the health or safety of the child. Specific examples include child abuse, torture, excessive corporal punishment that creates a substantial risk of serious physical harm or impairment to the child’s mental health and encouraging, permitting or compelling a child to act, model or otherwise participate in the production, presentation, dissemination or obscene, sexually oriented material
- (3) Exhibits evidence of any physical or mental injury or death, inflicted other than by accidental means, or an injury or death, which is at variance with the history given of it.
- (4) Because of the acts of his parents, guardian, or custodian, suffers physical or mental injury that harms or threatens to harm the child’s health or welfare.
- (5) Is subjected to out-of-home care child abuse.
