III. Report of the Faculty Senate President

President Bob Krebs announced that Violunder, longtime CSU employee and Administrative Coordinator for the Faculty Senavell be retiring, and Jane McCrone has accepted a part-time administrative assistant positin the Faculty Senate office.

He mentioned that reports from the CSU 2.0 faskes are due to be released to the campus soon, and noted that the Task Force specific toggetheorganization is metato provide options to the administration, and will not selfct final decisions. He reported the Board of Trustees Financial Affairs Committee had met earlier in they, and that while therfancial stress facing the university is not as severe ascerfeared, we still face budgetary choases that will require belt-tightening. He voiced support to avoid thing faculty and support staff.

He observed that the university may not nessentany colleges as we have had, in part because the demographics of figerar, first-time students in thegien are declining. He also urged our administrative leadership to think carefullyoabpast precedents. For example, in previous

college restructuring instances, changes have **breitera** rily faculty-driven, and where procedures are not specifically governed in bylavps; t-precedents should be followed.

IV. Report of the President of the University

President Harlan Sands noted that our fall seemestrollment has decled slightly, but that other universities in Ohio are facing much steetestlines. He thanked the faculty for everything they are doing to help to retastrudents, including working togethwith student leadership to approve a new policy to allow studenan expanded Pass/Fail option.

President Sands remarked on the curretnotiseOVID-19 protocols in place on campus seem to be working well, and he hopes that third countinue to be effective through the rest of this semester and spring semester. Henevaledged that this year has become allenging on all fronts, but that there have also been facultryd student successes to celepisatione of which were included in the recent State of the University

B. Professor Smith introduced a motion to

Continue the temporary Spring/Sumr2020 rules concerning academic standing for Fall 2020 through Summer 2021, for undergraduates only. (Report No. 22, 2020-2021)

He acknowledged the challenges that fachtye been facing under current teaching conditions and mentioned that will be administration consideration when making workload assignments to provide needed resources.

Provost Zhu closed his remarks assuring Stepate that CSU 2.0 planning is being conducted with the best interests for future intitual growth, and improved efficiency, which will allow the university to be in arsinger financial position going forward.

IX. Report of the President of SGA (Report No. 25, 2020-2021)

SGA Vice President Hana Shaheen reported testabout the successful "Vike the Vote" student event October 30. She adsentioned a new student-led infitiæ to encourage sustainability efforts by posting photos of indivial or group initatives both on- and off- campus; the SGA is working on this with CSU Sustainability irector, Jennife McMillan.

X. Report of Vice President, Gaduate and Professional Student Association (Report No. 26, 2020-2021)

GPSA Vice President Cody Orahos deported on various graduate dent social events that were scheduled, noting that it has been difficulted age graduate students to extra-curriculars during the pandemic. The group is planning a president development session to help graduate students learn to present the bree more successfully on Zoom.
